command, leading the command to be named the 2017 Project Good Neighbor Flagship. He also led the command's Coalition of Sailors Against Destructive Decisions (CSADD) Program, producing exceptional results, including the reduction of alcohol related incidents by 15% and disciplinary punishments by 35%. He has assisted 12 instructors in becoming Master Training Specialists and, as a Command Financial Specialist, mentored 166 entry level Sailors in the basics of budgeting and financial management. # ENLISTED RECOGNITION BREAKFAST

Guest speaker is CAPT Maxine Goodridge, USN, Commanding Officer of Naval Air Technical Training Center.

A native of Barbados, West Indies, CAPT Goodridge enlisted in the Navy in December 1982 in New York City, NY. Her first assignment was with Attack Squadron One Two Eight (VA-128), NAS Whidbey Island, Washington. As an undesignated Airman, she qualified as an A-6 Plane Captain and soon thereafter was assigned to Maintenance Control as an Aviation Maintenance Administrationman (AZ) striker.



Subsequent assignments include Patrol Squadron (VP-30); Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department (AIMD) Fleet Air Reconnaissance Squadron (VQ-2); Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron (HS-15); Commander, Helicopter Anti-Submarine Light Wing Atlantic Fleet (COMHSLWINGLANT); Carrier Airborne Early Warning Squadron (VAW-125); and as the Aircraft Intermediate Maintenance Department (AIMD) Officer aboard the USS Kearsarge (LHD-3).

In 2010, CAPT Goodridge reported to Commander, Fleet Air Forward (CFAF), Atsugi, Japan, where she served as the AIMD and Forward Reparable Inspection Activity Officer in Charge. In 2012, she reported to Commanding Officer, Center for Naval Aviation Technical Training Unit (CNATTU) Norfolk as the Executive Officer, and assumed command in 2013. She reported to Naval Personnel Command, Aviation Officer Assignments, NSA Mid-South, Millington, Tennessee, as Head Aviation Limited Duty Officer/Chief Warrant Officer Assignments in 2015.

In April 2017, CAPT Goodridge relieved CAPT Hugh Rankin, USN (Ret) as Commanding Officer of Naval Air Technical Training Center (NATTC) in Pensacola, Florida.

She earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Aviation Management from Southern Illinois University and a Master of Science degree in Business Management from Central Michigan University.

## NAVY LEAGUE U.S. AWARDS STEM GRANT TO SEA CADETS

he Navy League US awarded a STEM grant in the amount of \$1000 for the Sea Cadets Independence Squadron. The total cost to send the cadets for an overnight stay at the Flight Academy is more than \$7000. ## SEA CADETS INDEPENDENCE SQUADRON




A pril 2018 saw the culmination of the year's intensive training activities, study and mentorship for local area Sea Cadets. Twenty-three cadets of the Sea Cadet's Independence Squadron and thirteen cadets from Santa Rosa Council's Dunlap Division joined forces to plan and meet two-day customized missions set up by the National Flight Academy (NFA), aboard the simulated aircraft carrier "Ambition" (CVT-11) aboard NAS Pensacola. NFA Director, Mark Curley arranged a highly experienced crew of program analysts, training chiefs and security to guide the cadets from mission identification, navigation and problem resolution to complete a humanitarian mission. Involved were many aspects of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM). Virtually flying the aircraft simulators became the highlight of the program for all cadets.

Guests observed a unique set of award recognitions for our Sea Cadets in the Atrium of the National Museum of Naval Aviation. The 2017 Cadets of the Year from the Independence Squadron awarded the Theodore Roosevelt Medal for Achievement were: Naval Sea Cadet Corps, Petty Officer Third Class, **Joshua Conrad** and Navy League Cadet Corps, Petty Officer Third Class, **Casey Duncan**. The Pinning Ceremony, for Navy Sea Cadet Corps Petty Officer First Class **Marybeth Geary** to Chief Petty Officer, saw CPO Geary piped aboard through a line of actual US Navy CPO's. This marked the first time in 11 years that a female Sea Cadet of Independence Squadron has been pinned for earning the rank of Chief Petty Officer.


