


## Military Recognition Day



### El Galeon Visits Pensacola

ensacola was graced with another visiting tall ship from her sister city.

Spain's El Galeon Andalucia, a 170 foot, 495 ton, authentic wooden replica of a galleon that was part of Spain's West Indies fleet, moored at Pensacola's DeLuna Pier from October 28<sup>th</sup> through November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2015. Authenticated from sailing vessels used in Colonial times, the El Galeon's 22 member crew incorporate 16<sup>th</sup> century European sailing techniques and technology.


