he first Admirals' Club event of the year welcomes CAPT Christopher Martin, USN, the Commanding Officer of NAS Pensacola. Raised in Tennessee, CAPT Martin enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1984. His first duty station was in Norfolk, VA with the



"Tigertails" of VAW-125. He was selected for a fleet NROTC scholarship and attended Auburn University, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Aviation Management. He was commissioned as an ensign in 1992. His flight training included assignments with VT-4 at NAS Pensacola and VT-27 and VT-31 in Corpus Christi, TX, earning his "Wings of Gold" in 1995. Following his designation as a naval aviator, Martin completed carrier training with the "Greyhawks" of VAW-120. In 1996, he deployed onboard the USS John C. Stennis (CVN 74), for that carrier's maiden voyage around the world. He also served on the USS George Washington (CVN 73) and USS John F. Kennedy (CV 67), while participating in combat operations in support of Operation Southern Watch. In 2005, he

served on the USS Theodore Roosevelt (CVN 71) in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Martin earned a Master of Arts degree in National Security and Strategic Studies from the Naval War College in Newport, R.I., in 2007. He later served as a squadron commander while making additional deployments on the USS George Washington, and he worked as an interagency representative for U.S. Southern Command. Most recently, he served as faculty in Leadership and Warfighting at the Air War College, Maxwell Air Force Base, AL.

The honorees are nominated by their commands. Each nominee is recognized ceremoniously, with one outstanding military community service leader selected for the prestigious Margaret Flowers Civic Award. Margaret Flowers is a retired civil service employee who left a legacy of service to both the U.S. Navy and her community.



Guest speaker for this event is Donald Belcher, who is a 2000 recipient of the Margaret Flowers Civic Award.

Born in Marion, Alabama, Donald grew up in Cleveland, Ohio. After several years of college, Donald followed in his father's footsteps and joined the United States Marine Corps. During his time in the Marine Corps, Donald traveled the world and served in many occupations, including two tours serving as a Marine Corps Drill Instructor at Recruit Depot, Parris Island. As a staff sergeant serving aboard NAS Pensacola, Donald not only helped train and shape young Marines and Sailors, but he became active in the community. Donald supported a wide variety of organ-

izations including the American Cancer Society, the American Heart Association, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Manna Food Bank, Adopt-A-School, Toys for Tots and the Combined Federal Campaign. Donald's heart for service has been recognized throughout his career. He has been awarded Staff Non-commissioned Officer of the Year for Marine Aviation Training Support Group 21, NAS Pensacola. He is also a recipient of the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal. After completing his career with the Marines, Donald began the next chapter of his professional life, serving the members of his current employer, Navy Federal Credit Union. His passion for giving remains strong as Donald continues to support the Pensacola community though organizations like Toys for Tots, Relay for Life and Navy Federal's School Partnership Program. NAS Whiting Field Names Auditorium for War Hero

ceremony held January 17th aboard NAS Whiting Field, rededicated a building as the CDR Clyde E. Lassen Auditorium. The building is dedicated to Lassen to honor his courage and service to the nation.

A naval aviator who trained, taught, and commanded a squadron in Northwest Florida, CDR Lassen was the only U.S. Navy helicopter pilot to earn the Medal of Honor, during the Vietnam War. The ceremony served as a commemoration of the 50th anniversary of the Vietnam War.

Around midnight on June 19th, 1968, Lassen and his crew were sent in their UH-2 Seasprite, to rescue two aviators who were shot down over North Vietnam. Despite taking heavy fire in a damaged aircraft, and running extremely low on fuel, the team successfully picked up the pilots on the fifth attempt. It was the first night time helicopter rescue attempt over Vietnam, earning Lassen the Medal of Honor.

Lassen trained at NAS Pensacola before being commissioned as an officer. After his service in Vietnam, he served as an instructor pilot in the local area and concluded his career as Commanding Officer of Helicopter Training Squadron EIGHT at NAS Whiting Field.

National Naval Aviation Museum Historian, Hill Goodspeed was the keynote speaker for the event and retired Navy CAPT Dick Catone, a former Training Air Wing FIVE Commo-

dore, spoke during the ceremony. Catone, also a Vietnam era pilot, was a long-time friend of Lassen.

A flight training building aboard NAS Whiting Field, previously named for Lassen, was demolished due to heavy damage from Hurricane Ivan in 2004. A display case of Lassen memorabilia from that building is prominently placed in the auditorium lobby.

The Clyde E. Lassen auditorium serves as the location where Navy, Coast Guard, and Marine Corps aviators receive their Wings of Gold, designating them as Naval Aviators.


