The four-masted "tall ship" hosted daily tours for the public while the Spanish Navy's 80 midshipmen enjoyed the unique sights, sounds and flavors of downtown Pensacola, during one of only two port visits in the United States. The day before the ships departure for her final port visit and return voyage home to Spain, the Pensacola Council hosted a traditional southern fish fry for the Elcano crew.

Finally, on June 4th, NAS Pensacola held a remembrance ceremony, at the National Museum of Naval Aviation, marking the 73rd anniversary of the pivotal 1942 Battle of Midway, that turned the tide for the U.S. in the Pacific during WWII. The sacrifices and bravery of all members of our military in this remarkable victory, helped to secure our freedoms, and shall always be remembered. I hope everyone has a safe and enjoyable summer and we look forward to seeing all of our members at our annual membership meeting and Chicken BBQ, held October 1st, at the Pensacola Yacht Club.

Pensacola Welcomes the Elcano

he highly anticipated visit of the Juan Sebastián de Elcano, a Naval Academy Training ship for the Spanish Navy, took place May 27th, at the Port of Pensacola. Pensacola is one of only two ports in America the ship visits this year. Members of the Pensacola Council



welcomed Spain's "floating embassy" as she moored among fan fare and music from the Navy Band of Corry Station. The ship, revered as the third largest "tall ship" in the world, docked at Pensacola, for five days as part of the celebration honoring General Bernardo de Galvez, the Revolutionary War hero, who won the battle of Pensacola, on May 9th, 1781. The Elcano has visited Pensacola six previous times. The first in 1959, during Pensacola's 400th anniversary. Special thanks to Dame Maria Davis, Pensacola's Honorary Vice Consul of Spain, who is responsible for the Elcano's return to Pensacola.

The day of the Elcano's arrival, board
