


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

n March 5, 2016 the Honorary Vice Consul to Spain, Maria Davis, led a diplomatic and cultural delegation from Pensacola, Florida to Madrid, Spain.

The delegation traveling from Pensacola to Spain, included members of the United States Navy League. Pensacola Council. This presented an opportunity for international Navy League Council interaction. As part of the delegation itinerary while in Madrid meetings with the President of the United States Navy League, Madrid Council were scheduled. These meetings allowed for an in person exchange of information, experiences and contacts between the President of the Madrid Council, Molly Long and the 3rd Vice President of the Pensacola Council CAPT Dan McCort USN (ret).



John Henry Ochs, a very active member of the Pensacola Council of the Navy League, passed away May 3rd, at the age of 69. After serving in the Navy during the Vietnam War time frame, he entered the financial industry, where he worked in all aspects of banking. His financial background ultimately brought him to the Pensacola area in 1998, as the Chief Operating Officer for Pen Air Federal Credit Union, where he served until 2014. It was also shortly after his arrival in the area, that he joined the Consumer Credit Counseling Service of West Florida and was a member of the Board of Directors, from 2002 until 2014. He also became active in the Navy League as a Board Member in 2001 and rose to become the

President in 2007, and subsequently became the Gulf Coast Area President for three years and a National Director. Because of John's interest in the Navy, he was on the Military Recognition Day Selection Committee numerous times and was selected to be the Treasurer of the Veterans Memorial Park Board.

When the Navy League had a difficult time obtaining suitable office space, John arranged for an area in the Pen Air Federal Credit Union building, onboard Naval Air Station, where the Office still exists.

John is survived by his wife, Wendi and two sons, Andrew and Jeffrey, of Pensacola.

The community was rocked June 2nd, when a U.S. Navy F/A-18, flown by Marine CAPT Jeff Kuss, the opposing solo pilot #6, of the Navy's Blue Angels Flight demonstration Squadron, crashed during an afternoon practice in Tennessee.

CAPT Kuss' final flight was June 7th, as his body was flown back to the Blue Angels home base at NAS Pen-

Kuss, a native of Durango, Colorado, graduated with a degree in economics in 2006 and was commissioned the same year, following Of-

ficer Candidate School, as a lieutenant in the Marine Corps. He completed flight training at Naval Air Station Pensacola in 2007, and received his wings in 2009. He graduated from the Navy's TOPGUN fighter weapons school in 2012.

CAPT Kuss joined the Blue Angels in 2014. He had more than 1,400 flight hours and 175 carrier landings. His decorations included the Strike Flight Air Medal and the Marine Corps Achievement Medal. He was a beloved husband, father, son and member of the Blue Angels Family.


