

On the heels of a superb MRD Ceremony the Pensacola Navy League helped welcome the magnificent Spanish Navy "Tall Ship" Juan Sebastián de Elcano back to the emerald coast and Pensacola for an unprecedented ninth time. And what a visit it was. In a phenomenal demonstration of Navy cooperation and tradition, Naval Air Station Pensacola, commanded by newly installed CAPT Tim Kinsella, USN, welcomed CAPT Ignacio Paz Garcia of the Spanish Navy and his crew of the Elcano, pier-side at NAS Pensacola on Sunday, March 31st, 2019. The arrival was preceded by cannon salute and ceremonial Navy Band music as sailors and marines "manned the seawall" to honor our Spanish visitors. A whirlwind week of activities followed with events dedicated to commemorate the 500th Anniversary of Magellan's historic voyage to attempt the world's first circumnavigation of the globe. In true Pensacola fashion, the Elcano Officers, Midshipmen and crew were welcomed with events that included; "Black Tie" formal aboard ship, "Wreath Laying" at sea, Regatta Competition at the Pensacola Yacht Club, "Line Dancing" at the Pensacola Navy League Reception, formal Mass and "Wreath Laying" at the Galvez Statue downtown, educational workshops in partnership with UWF and Navy Flight School Students, tours of NAS Pensacola, the Naval Aviation Museum and the National Flight Academy, all capped off with a farewell reception at Quarters "A", the home of NETC, RADM Kyle Cozad, USN (Ret). Like I said, it was a whirlwind week. The Elcano crew left here exhausted but forever in love with Pensacola.

Due to the historic nature of the Elcano visit which was to celebrate the 5<sup>th</sup> Centennial of Magellan's voyage, there was an official component to the visit as well. Pensacola's own Dame Maria Davis, Honorary Vice Consul to Spain, hosted the Spanish Consul General from Miami, Candido Creis and the Spanish Naval Attache from Washington, D.C., CAPT Juan Garcia. Our guests were made Honorary Citizens of Pensacola by our esteemed Mayor Grover Robinson.

As mentioned in our last communication the pace of activity for the Pensacola Navy League will now continue to accelerate. In the near term, our Enlisted Recognition Breakfast will be held April 25<sup>th</sup> at Heritage Hall in Seville Quarter. The ERB will be followed quickly by the Spouse Appreciation Luncheon on May 22<sup>nd</sup> at New World Landing. We will then honor our MRD Awardees further by including them in the Fiesta of Five Flags Grande Fiesta Parade held downtown on May 31<sup>st</sup>. # MARGARET FLOWERS CIVIC AWARD

he Pensacola Council Navy League is proud of the efforts of military personnel who contribute their time to enrich the community. For 39 years, the council has recognized the efforts of these men and women during the annual Margaret Flowers Civic Award, Military Recognition Day ceremony. This year's ceremony, held February 21st, at New World Landing, boasted an attendance of more than 300 military personnel, veterans and guests. The lunch event, emceed by popular local TV sports broadcaster Dan Shugart, recognized the community service efforts of individual military personnel who were nominated by their local command. Twenty-two nominees were recognized and presented with certificates and gifts from Navy Federal Credit Union and Pen Air Federal Credit Union. One of the nominees was selected to receive the Margaret Flowers Civic Award traveling trophy. The award's namesake, Margaret Flowers, is in honor of Ms. Flowers' long and devoted record of service to the Navy and the community. This year's winner of the Margaret Flowers Civic Award is ABH1 (AW/SW) Brian J. Clark, USN, from Naval Air Station Whiting Field. As the Command Volunteer Program Coordinator, Petty Officer First Class Clark ensured the Sailors of Naval Air Station Whiting Field have engrained themselves into the local communities by improving all facets of the NAS Whiting Field Command Volunteer Program. He has displayed unwavering community leadership and citizenry through organizing and active participation in Santa Rosa and Escambia county volunteer events. He volunteered in 96 community service events, accumulating more than 533 volunteer hours with such organizations as Meals on Wheels, the Shepard House and numerous other divergent organizations. Additionally, his efforts resulted in more than 3000 hours from over 600 personnel, actively volunteering in 69 individual events and creating eight new community service partnerships. His managerial skills were vital in Naval Air Station Whiting Field 's submission of five Flagship Awards in July 2018. His hard work resulted in NAS Whiting Field being selected by Commander, Navy Southeast Region, as the regional nominee for the Personal Excellence

Flagship Award for small commands. His efforts exemplify the meaning of Community leadership and outreach. The selection criteria is based on civic work in the community, leadership, rate proficiency and representation of appear-

ance.



# ADMIRALS' CLUB

he first Admirals' Club speaker series event of 2019 featured guest speaker and Pensacola Chapter board member CAPT Kevin Miller, USN (Ret). Kevin Miller has done extensive research on the South China Sea for his latest technothriller, *Fight Fight*. His talk focused on escalating threats taking place in this region.



In defiance of international law, The People's Republic of China lays political claim to the entire South China Sea, through which \$4 trillion in annual trade flows. This sea is believed to hold a wealth of untapped oil and gas reserves. It is also one of the world's richest fisheries. China claims dominance of the region by building islands made of dredge



sand dumped on reefs into military bases, all in international waters that they believe belong to the People's Republic.

On the larger islands, China has built airfields for the deployment of military aircraft, including fighters and bombers, along with potential missile, radar and helicopter infrastructure at many of the smaller islands. Several of the islands serve as bases for Surface to Air Missile systems. Chinese warships intermingled with armed Chinese fishing vessels add to the threat. China continues construction, expanding its military presence.

Kevin is a third generation naval officer and flew the A-7E *Corsair II* and FA-18C *Hornet*, serving aboard the aircraft carriers USS *Nimitz* (CVN-68), USS *Dwight D. Eisenhower* (CVN-69), USS *George Washington* (CVN-73), USS *Theodore Roosevelt* (CVN-71) and USS *Enterprise* (CVN-65). He commanded a carrier-based strike-fighter squadron, and, during his career, logged over



1,000 carrier-arrested landings. Today he is a self-employed defense consultant and an Amazon Best-Selling author of three highly rated action-adventure novels. His latest work, *Fight Fight*, captures his insight of modern naval and aerial warfare and his extensive research on Pacific region geopolitics.

The lunch event, held on March 19<sup>th</sup> at the Pensacola Yacht Club was emceed by VADM Jerry Unruh, USN (Ret). VADM Unruh auctioned off a copy of *Fight Fight* to support the Pensacola Chapter of the Navy League, with the winning bid of \$200 going to Ms. Pat Smith.

The next Admirals' Club guest speaker series, "Meet the Boss" will be held June 19<sup>th</sup>, 11:30 am at Pensacola Yacht Club. Guest Speaker will be CAPT Timothy Kinsella, USN, Commanding Officer of NAS Pensacola.


