

When a new date has been determined, we anticipate that there will be two USS Tripoli Crew Receptions at Seville Quarter the week prior to the Saturday Commissioning Ceremony. Having two in one year is unprecedented, and we may even have a third this year. The U.S. Coast Guard is looking at NAS Pensacola to Commission the Coast Guard Cutter STONE in December.

Military Recognition Day

he Pensacola Navy League is proud of the efforts of military personnel who contribute their time to enrich the community. For 40 years, the council has recognized the efforts of these men and women during the annual Margaret Flowers Civic Award, Military Recognition Day ceremony. This year's



ceremony, held February 20th, at New World Landing, boasted an attendance of more than 300 military personnel, veterans and guests. The lunch event, emceed by popular local TV sports broadcaster Dan Shugart, recognized the community service efforts of individual military personnel who were nominated by their local command. Nineteen nominees were recognized and presented with certificates and gifts from Navy Federal Credit Union and Pen Air Federal Credit Union. One of the nominees was selected to receive the Margaret Flowers Civic Award traveling trophy. The award's namesake, Margaret Flowers, is in honor of Ms. Flowers' long and devoted record of service to the Navy and the community. This year's winner of the Marga-

ret Flowers Civic Award is **Petty Officer First Class Kwame Kusi-Appiah**, representing the Naval Flight Demonstration Squadron, The Blue Angels of NAS Pensacola. Born in Guana, South Africa, Petty Officer First Class Kusi-Appiah is a 1st Class Logistics Specialist with the Blue Angels Flight Demonstration Team. Even though he was on the road for much of the year, Petty Officer First Class Kusi-Appiah coordinated and completed more than 3000 hours of community volunteer work, including 525 hours devoted to Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northwest Florida, the USO and local elementary schools. He has also mentored a local second grade student.

The guest speaker was David Harmer, the President and CEO of Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge.

MAYOR SPEAKS AT ADMIRALS' CLUB EVENT

he Admirals' Club first event of the new year, a "Meet the Boss' luncheon, was held January 28th at the Pensacola Yacht Club.



The guest speaker was Grover C. Robinson IV, a real estate developer and the current Mayor of Pensacola.

Serving in that role since 2018, Mayor Robinson previously served twelve years as County Commissioner for Escambia County District 4.

The mayor spoke of where Pensacola has been and the progressive direction the city is headed to. Reflecting on the city's unique history, Mayor Robinson stressed the importance of Pensacola having a good "quality of place" that provides residents a desirable location to grow, work, and play and how we can be a city other Florida communities look to as a role model.

His salary has been donated to Pensacola Energy and the city's sanitation services to help residents pay their utility bills while they are out of work.




WELCOME HOME USCG CUTTER DECISIVE


