

Military Recognition Day honors military members who have demonstrated significant community service. The Pensacola Council will recognize those members during a luncheon and ceremony, held February 21st, 11:30 am at Skopelos-New World Landing. Honorees are nominated by their commands. Each nominee is recognized, with one outstanding military community service leader selected for the prestigious Margaret Flowers Civic Award. Margaret Flowers is a retired civil service employee who left a legacy of service to both the U.S. Navy and her community.

This year's guest speaker is Coach David Wilson, the Studer 55 Community Athletics Coordinator. Wilson has spent 25 years coaching football from the High School ranks, to the highest level of Division I College Football, to the Professional level, collecting one NCAA National Championship, one Southeastern Conference Division Championship, one Atlantic Coast Conference Championship and one Florida State High School Championship.



Currently he enters his second year as the Director of Player Personnel for the AFL's Tampa Bay Storm. Wilson served as Special Teams Coach and Recruiting Coordinator for the Georgia Tech Yellow Jackets, appearing in four straight Bowl Games. His recruitment of such players as Calvin Johnson and Deshard Choice, greatly aided to the success of Georgia Tech.

Wilson joined the Georgia Tech staff after five years with Coach Jackie Sherrill at Mississippi State, where he served as the Director of Football Operations for three seasons. During his time there, the Bulldogs were S.E.C. Western Division Champions in 1998, and played in the Cotton, Peach and Independence Bowls.

Elcano Returns to Pensacola



he Spanish Royal Navy tall ship Juan Sebastián de Elcano will return to Pensacola on March 31st through April 5th.

The visit is part of a world cruise to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the first circumnavigation of the Earth, led by Ferdinand Magellan and Juan Sebastian de Elcano. Magellan died in a battle between warring tribes on Cebu, an island in the Philippines. Elcano finished the voyage.

The

Elcano, the third-largest tall ship in the world, last visited Pensacola in 2015, and drew thousands of visitors.

Maria Davis, Pensacola's honorary vice consul of Spain, stated she received confirmation of the visit from Spanish Navy Vice Admiral Ignacio Horcada, who received flight training at Pensacola Naval Air Station.

For the past twenty years, Davis has been instrumental in solidifying Pensacola's relationship with Spain, bringing in various Spanish dignitaries and politicians, including a visit from the king and queen of Spain in 2009.





The ship was commissioned in 1928 and has traveled more distance than any ship in history with more than two million nautical miles to its credit. It is 371 feet long and its crew includes 21 officers, 21 chiefs and 150 enlisted sailors.

The visit is organized by the Pensacola Elcano Society in conjunction with the Fiesta of Five Flags organization, in celebration of Pensacola's rich history under the United States, Spanish, British, French and Confederate rule.

This will be the Elcano's eighth visit to the city since 1959.

ADMIRALS' CLUB

E ach year the Admirals' Club hosts a speaker series luncheon. This year's event will be held at 11:30 am on Tuesday, March 19th, at the Pensacola Yacht Club.

The guest speaker will be CAPT Kevin Miller, USN (Ret). Kevin is a third generation naval officer. In his career, he flew the A-7E *Corsair II* and FA-18C *Hornet*, deploying overseas six times throughout the 1980's and 90's aboard the aircraft carriers USS *Nimitz* (CVN-68), USS *Dwight D. Eisenhower* (CVN-69), USS *George Washington* (CVN-73), USS *Theodore Roosevelt* (CVN-71)and USS *Enterprise* (CVN-65). He finished his career in the Pentagon, serving on the staff of the Secretary of the Navy, retiring in 2005. After leaving the service,



Kevin was employed as an associate at two Washington DC defense consulting firms, and it was during this time he drafted his first novel, *Raven One*. In 2010 he joined the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation as Executive Vice President and Chief Operating Officer. Today he is a self-employed defense consultant and an Amazon Best-Selling author of three military action-adventure novels. His latest work, *Fight Fight*, captures his insight of modern naval and aerial warfare and extensive research on the Pacific region.

Captain Miller's talk will focus on the very real and serious events taking place in the South China Sea.

With Navy League's guidance and support, many new avenues of career paths were exposed to the 24 + Middle and High School Boys and Girls. (With graduating Seniors and incoming youth, the squadron has been averaging between 24 and 30 cadets, over the years.)

Independence Squadron is a strong and very active unit, and compares favorably among other units in areas of our size populations. Big factors include the strength of our Council and the large presence of military units and retirees. Cadets acknowledge the importance of their participation assisting with all of the Sea Services.

In addition to the ongoing monthly 2-day drill period activities of military training, study, ranking up, sea bag and uniform inspections, cadets regularly enjoy special activities away from their Bldg. 626A headquarters.

Some special activities, often community service, include:

* Assist WWII vets being flown in WWII Stearman aircraft, during the Blue Angel pre-show over Pensacola Beach. Cadets engaged with vets to get to know them and hear some of their stories. One very fortunate cadet, who had won a special test competition, Cadet Bennett, was given a thrilling ride in a Stearman.

* MWR invited cadets to help with activities at the Blue Angel Homecoming Airshow.

- * Training aboard one of the US Coast Guard Ships, relocated to NAS Pensacola, USCG Cutter Dauntless provided introductory training on the Bridge, in the Engine Room and in Search and Rescue operations.
- * USS Alabama (in Mobile, AL)

-Cadets participated, as WWII sailors, in a Living History defense of the ship against attacking aircraft.

- * Wreaths Across America, a nationwide annual holiday event, where cadets could help with laying thousands of wreaths at Barrancas National Cemetery.
- * Winter and Summer Training at remote locations where cadets and other youth, from across the country, could learn leadership and exceptional skills.
- * Awards Ceremonies: Pensacola Council Cadets of the Year, National NL Theodore Roosevelt Medals,
