



The new fiscal year brings with it fresh funding streams and consequently permanent change of station (PCS) orders and relocation for Sea Service families. 


The 21st annual POW/MIA luncheon, hosted by the Pensacola Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge and the Pensacola Navy League, was held September 17th at Pensacola Yacht Club. The moving ceremony opens each year

with the "Table of Remembrance" poem, poignantly read by Capt. Nat Mack, USAF (Ret). The Escambia High School NJROTC presented the colors followed by "Taps" performed by Joe and Katie Meyer. Capt Mack's brother is listed as MIA/KIA during the Korean War. The brother's dog tags are part of the "Remember" memorial. Guest speaker was Dr. Leo Murphy, Professor of Aeronautics and Flight at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University in Daytona Beach. Dr. Murphy, a retired Naval Aviator, has authored several books on the history of aviation in Pensacola. He shared the story of his latest work, "Lost in Heaven" which chronicles the life of LT James Polkinghorne. Polkinghorne was a Tuskegee Airman from Pensacola, who at the age of 22, disappeared while flying a mission over Italy during WWII. His remains were never recovered. CAPT Mike Denkler, USN (Ret) served as the emcee.









ADMIRALS' CLUB

The Pensacola Navy League Admirals' Club hosted a guest speaker series luncheon on September 25th featuring John H. Appleyard, historian, author, civic leader, former Pensacola advertising executive and WWII veteran. Appleyard, a gifted storyteller, has authored many prolific writings on the history of Pensacola. At the age of 96, he pens a weekly column in the Pensacola News Journal and broadcasts the Game of the Week at the Blue Wahoos baseball stadium. Appleyard presented on the history of Naval Air Station Pensacola, from its rich history beginning in 1559 when Don Tristan DeLuna founded a colony on what is now Fort Barrancas, to its establishment in 1914 as a Navy Yard. VADM Jerry Unruh, USN (Ret) served as emcee.




CHICKEN BARBECUE

Golf Tournament


