












The "Heroes Among Us" series, sponsored by the Marine Corps League, in support of the "Veterans in Distress Fund", featured two Pensacola Council members as

n Saturday, September 9th, our Navy League's Independence Squadron celebrated the 55th anniversary of the Sea Cadet Birthday at the National Naval Aviation Museum's Flight Academy, aboard Naval Air Station Pensacola.

A bit of Sea Cadet history:

The US Department of the Navy, in 1958, requested the Navy League of the U.S., establish a youth program, which they agreed to do that year.

On September 10th, 1962, a congressional bill was signed into law, PL 87-655, federally establishing the NLSC and US Naval Sea Cadet Corps programs. Doing the math, it's the 55th birthday for the Sea Cadets.

Since then, partnerships have been arranged with:

International Sea Cadet Association (ISCA), allowing exchanges with Sea Cadets of other nations.

Flying Midshipman Association, supporting education in aviation knowledge and skills. (Those may offer some new opportunities for our Sea Cadets.)

The excitement of the cake cutting by the youngest and the oldest Sea Cadets present, was only



surpassed by the flight activities that followed.

With the direction of the Flight Academy Operations Officer, Mark Curley, a special tour of the facility was conducted. This included a review of aviators Survival Equipment, survival applications on sea and land, operation of the remote control battle screens, a visit to the Ready Room for briefing and culminating in the Flight Simulator operations. On the main deck, there are 42 simulators, pro-

vide by Boeing and Lockheed, that hold two students each. The software, the same as what is in the F-35C aircraft, projects flight conditions on screens while the Sea Cadets (and actual military students) guide the airplane with throttle and control stick. All Sea Cadets, in attendance, participated and there were no crashes. Plans are underway to seek funding for an expanded three-day training experience in April 2018.

It is evident that the variety of valuable programs, coordinated by our Sea Cadet leadership, will have a lasting impact on the lives of our local youth, and ultimately will contribute to our nation's successful ventures.

We owe an expression of gratitude to those leaders involved in our Sea Cadet activities and their development to admirable maturity. Foremost among these leaders are: Larry Martin, C.O.; Curtis Duncan, X.O.; Carey Bennett, NL Representative; and all the parents and military personnel who enthusiastically participate in our Sea Cadet events. Top leadership influence comes from Tom Pruter, Navy League National Vice President for Awards, STEM and Youth Programs and from the Pensacola Council Navy League President, Nan Harper.


"In reference to "The Carrier" movie, I enjoyed it very


