Military Recognition Day honors military members who have demonstrated significant community service. The Pensacola Council will recognize those members during a luncheon and ceremony, held February 22nd, 11:30 am at Skopelos-New World Landing.

The honorees are nominated by their commands. Each nominee is recognized ceremoniously, with one outstanding military community service leader selected for the prestigious Margaret Flowers Civic Award. Margaret Flowers is a retired civil service employee who left a legacy of service to both the U.S. Navy and her community.

This year's guest speaker is Pete Shinnick, the head football coach at the University of West Florida and the 2017 American Football Coach Association Region 2, Coach of the Year.

In 2005, Shinnick was named the head coach at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, the first football coach at the university since the school discontinued the program in the 1950s. On January 31, 2014, the University of West Florida announced it had hired Shinnick as the head coach of its newly established football team, the Argonauts. The team began play in 2016.



On November 12, 2017, the Argonauts made the NCCA Division II playoffs in only their second season, making them the fastest team in NCAA history to do so.

In November 2017, Dan and Kevin traveled to Washington D.C. to participate in the NLUS Legislative Affairs (LA) Congressional Fly-In event. Also attending were CAPT Thomas Pruter, USN (Ret) NLUS National Vice President, Awards, STEM and Youth Programs, CNOCM Mark Harden, USN (Ret) NLUS President, Southern Region and CAPT Bill Hewitt, USN (Ret) NLUS Director, Southern Region.



Here is Dan's report:

The objective of the Fly-In was for the Navy League to reach out to as many Members of Congress (MOC) as possible, prior to their vote on Military Appropriations funding concerning the Sea Services. We ended up with 73 NLUS members from around the country teaming up to visit an unprecedented 210 MOC representatives.

I was paired with Mark Harden. We were designated as Southern Team #1 Gulf Coast. Kevin Miller was paired with Tom Pruter and Bill Hewitt. They were designated as Southern Team #2 Gulf Coast. Teams were generally comprised of 3-5 people. All teams were given a schedule of appointments prearranged by the NLUS LA Office. Training in preparation for the visit was conducted by the NLUS LA team in DC the day prior to the actual MOC office calls. During the training, customized presentation handouts were provided to each Team for their use while visiting each MOC office and for MOC retention following the visit. Southern Team #1 was tasked with visiting Congressman Steve Palazzo from the Mississippi 4th District, Congressman Garret Graves from the Louisiana 6th District, Congressman Neal Dunn from the Florida 2nd District, Congressman Matt Gaetz from the Florida 1st District. In most cases, meetings were conducted with MOC staff members in lieu of the actual MOC. This was due to the vote on tax reform being conducted during the period of the Fly-In.

The general consensus reached by the many Fly-In Teams following their office calls was that our outreach as NLUS unpaid volunteers was well received by all MOC representatives and their staff members. In addition, we happily discovered that most of the MOC representatives were well informed and very supportive of the Sea Services and their unique funding needs. Time will now tell how effective our visit was as the many funding votes are conducted and tallied.

I heartily endorse participation by any of our Pensacola Council members in the next Fly-In event, should circumstances allow. Having direct contact/involvement with MOC representatives provides an opportunity to influence the support that our Sea Services receive in a way not possible from the local council level.

he United States Naval Sea Cadets Corps (USNCC) conducted Field Operations during their October Drill weekend at Blue Angel Recreational Park.

During the first day of drill, the Cadets received training on field medicine. Leading the Training was HMCM Kennovin, who works at the Naval Hospital. He trained the Cadets on proper field medical techniques using visual aids (mock injury kits). Then the cadets split into teams and participated in litter (stretcher) races where each team ran to a simulated injured cadet, treated the wound, then loaded the cadet on the stretcher and carried them back.

IT1 Sullivan and 1st LT Gotwalt provided training on land navigation and field communications. This was in preparation for the patrols the cadets were to hike the next day where they would utilize all of the skills. On the second day, cadets, in separate patrol groups, followed a route through the woods with simulated opposition forces. They practiced their field communication techniques when they reported situations back to base camp. They encountered opposition forces and some Cadets were simulated as being injured. These Cadets received field medical treatment from their ship-

mates and were carried back to base camp on stretchers.



In November, the Cadets were finally able to operate their Sea Perch units that they built during the June Drill. They were able to build the Sea Perch units with the dedicated help from the Navy League's Tom Pruter, who promotes STEM projects with our youth. The Cadets broke up into three teams and conducted relay races through submerged hula hoops with their Remote Operated Sea Perch Units. Team "Big Dog" was the winner with Team "Turtle" as a close second.



Thanks to the Navy League for helping the Sea Cadets build these remotely operated vehicles at no cost to the Sea Cadets and thanks to the Commanding Officer at NAS Pensacola Schools Command for allowing the Sea Cadets to utilize the indoor pool to conduct tests of the units.

Sea Cadets is a program for young men and women in a drug and gang free environment that promotes teamwork, responsibility, respect, and leadership skills. Graduates of the

Sea Cadets frequently choose a career serving in our country's Armed Forces, but this is NOT a requirement to join. The skills learned in this program are useful in any life path the youth chooses. If a cadet does choose the Armed Services, they frequently will have earned early advancement in the US Navy and Coast Guard (E-3 after boot camp). As many as 12%





of the graduates of the US Naval Academy are former Sea Cadets.


