SEA CADETS INDEPENDENCE SQUADRON





Coast Guard Moves Two Cutters to Pensacola



he U.S. Coast Guard will relocate two 210-foot medium endurance cutters to Pensacola Naval Air Station by August 2018.

"This is incredible news for Pensacola and for all Northwest Floridians," said U.S. Representative Matt Gaetz, R-Pensacola. "Not only is Northwest Florida gaining 152 new

families, but the safety and security of the Emerald Coast and the Eastern Gulf of Mexico is significantly enhanced."

The crews of the Coast Guard Cutter *Decisive*, a 210-foot cutter based in Pascagoula, Mississippi, and the Coast Guard Cutter *Dauntless*, a 210-foot cutter based in Galveston, Texas, will relocate to Pensacola.



duct a variety of Coast Guard missions, including counter drug enforcement, alien migration interdiction operations, search and rescue and maritime law enforcement.

The cutters will be home-ported at NAS Pensacola, along with the Coast Guard Cutter *Cypress*.

Ongratulations to Petty Officer First Class Justin Sullivan, Information Systems Technician from Corry Station. Sullivan was selected among hundreds of nominees to be this year's Navy Times Service Member of the Year.

A married father of two small children, Sullivan was recognized in February 2017 by the Pensacola Council as a nominee of the Margaret Flowers Civic Award during Military Recognition Day. His volunteer experience is extensive, including his work as a teacher and mentor to the Sea Cadets. Sullivan, who has been stationed at Corry Station for the past two years, served two combat tours.

During his first deployment to Afghanistan in 2012, Sullivan directed five combat operations as a radio operator, including three medical evacuations from remote outposts. It was his expertise that was credited with saving the lives of two Afghan soldiers, with the Navy Special Warfare Group. He has been awarded the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, three Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, two Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medals, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal, NATO Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Good Conduct Medals, and Overseas Service and Sea Service Deployment ribbons.
